



The Summary of Benefits and Coverage (SBC) document will help you choose a health [plan](#). <p>What is the overall <a href="#">deductible</a>?</p>	<p><b>\$2,500</b> person / <b>\$5,000</b> family In-network  <b>\$5,000</b> person / <b>\$10,000</b> family Out-of-network</p>	<p>Generally, you must pay all the costs from <a href="#">providers</a> up to the <a href="#">deductible</a> amount before this <a href="#">plan</a> begins to pay. If you have other family members on the <a href="#">plan</a>, the overall family <a href="#">deductible</a> must be met before the <a href="#">plan</a> begins to pay.</p>
<p>Are there services covered before you meet your <a href="#">deductible</a>?</p>	<p>Yes. <a href="#">Preventive care</a> services are covered before you meet your <a href="#">deductible</a>.</p>	<p>This <a href="#">plan</a> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <a href="#">deductible</a> amount. But a <a href="#">copayment</a> or <a href="#">coinsurance</a> may apply. For example, this <a href="#">plan</a> covers certain <a href="#">preventive services</a> without <a href="#">cost-sharing</a> and before you meet your <a href="#">deductible</a>. <p>Are there other <a href="#">deductibles</a> for specific services?</p>	<p>No.</p>	<p>You don't have to meet <a href="#">deductibles</a> for specific services.</p>
<p>What is the <a href="#">out-of-pocket limit</a> for this <a href="#">plan</a>?</p>	<p><b>\$5,000</b> person / <b>\$10,000</b> family In-network  <b>\$8,000</b> person / <b>\$16,000</b> family Out-of-network  <b>\$6,000</b> In-network Maximum amount that any one person will satisfy towards the annual family out-of-pocket</p>	<p>The <a href="#">out-of-pocket limit</a> is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this <a href="#">plan</a>, they have to meet their own <a href="#">out-of-pocket limits</a> until the overall family <a href="#">out-of-pocket limit</a> has been met.</p>
<p>What is not included in the <a href="#">out-of-pocket limit</a>?</p>	<p>Penalties, <a href="#">premiums</a>, <a href="#">balance billing</a> charges, and health care this <a href="#">plan</a> doesn't cover.</p>	<p>Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the <a href="#">out-of-pocket limit</a>.</p>
<p>Will you pay less if you use a <a href="#">network provider</a>?</p>	<p>Yes. See <a href="http://www.umar.com">www.umar.com</a> or call 1-877-852-2545 for a list of <a href="#">network providers</a>.</p>	<p>This <a href="#">plan</a> uses a <a href="#">provider network</a>. You will pay less if you use a <a href="#">provider</a> in the <a href="#">plan's network</a>. You will pay the most if you use an <a href="#">out-of-network provider</a>, and you might receive a bill from a <a href="#">provider</a> for the difference between the <a href="#">provider's</a> charge and what your <a href="#">plan</a> pays (<a href="#">balance billing</a>). Be aware, your <a href="#">network provider</a> might use an <a href="#">out-of-network provider</a> for some services (such as lab work). Check with your <a href="#">provider</a> before you get services.</p>
<p>Do you need a <a href="#">referral</a> to see a <a href="#">specialist</a>?</p>	<p>No.</p>	<p>You can see the <a href="#">specialist</a> you choose without a <a href="#">referral</a>.</p>

**Does this [plan](#) Provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes**
